

GENERAL INFORMATION YOU SHOULD KNOW

REMIND 101 – All choir students and parents are **REQUIRED** to sign up for Remind 101. It will be an important way for Ms. Michael to provide you with up to the minute choir information. You will receive a “remind” notice via text when an email has been sent or quick reminders about deadlines, social activities, changes to events/meetings, etc. See the enclosed explanation. **IF YOU ARE A RETURNING CHOIR MEMBER/PARENT, YOU MUST RE-SIGN UP FOR REMIND THIS YEAR AS YOU WILL HAVE A NEW CODE.**

ATTENDANCE

Please review our enclosed calendar carefully to avoid conflicts. Work schedules, other non-school activities, and family trips must not interfere with the schedule. Students that enroll in other school activities such as athletics, band, drama, etc. need to plan ahead to resolve unavoidable conflicts. **Ask to receive a complete semester calendar from all of your activities so that you can have the maximum amount of time to work out potential conflicts.** Ms. Michael will work together with other teachers, coaches, directors to work out conflicts. Each student will be given every opportunity to participate in other activities.

Please have a parent/guardian email Ms. Michael no later than seven days prior to the conflict. Students may not excuse themselves from the event.

CHOIR FEE(S) - Each choir student must pay an annual fee to cover the use of the concert costume (including maintenance and alterations), the purchase of the choir t-shirt worn at Fallapalooza and other community performances and the choir folder. In addition, the new choir member fee will include shoes and earrings for the ladies and tux shirt for the men. **The new member fee is \$50 and the returning member fee is \$30.** Student Account may be used [to pay this fee or checks should be made payable to cap+s (due by Friday, September 8)].

CHOIR COSTUMES - All choirs have a specified costume which they are expected to wear for all performances. Each student will have a fitting within the first few weeks of school. Girls wear long black concert dress (owned by Choir Dept.), 2” black heels and rhinestone earrings (owned by student but purchased by the Choral Dept. and included in Choir fee). Boys wear black tux, vest and tie (owned by Choir Dept.) and white tux shirt (owned by student but purchased by Choir Dept.). Black shoes and socks must be worn but are not provided.

SHOWCHOIR COSTUMES will wear designated costumes which will be purchased for you with your show choir fees. You will own these costumes and take them home at the end of the school year unless otherwise designated. **Payment is separate from Choir Fee** and a payment schedule will be sent home.

DICKENS CAROLERS COSTUMES will wear costumes owned by choral dept. They will be responsible for their own shoes. There will be a charge for the Caroler’s sweatshirt.

A CAPPELLA GROUP COSTUMES - Costumes to be determined. Cost to be determined.

CHOIRS

Concert Choir – Freshmen – Senior treble and bass voices

Hersey Chorale – Sophomore – senior treble voices (auditioned)

Chamber Singers/Dickens Carolers – Sophomore – Senior treble & bass voices (auditioned)

Beginning Mixed Choir/Super Singers – Choir for students of all-abilities that come together through singing, building long-standing friendships, raising ability awareness, and serving as agents of change for our

school and community – no audition or previous choir experience needed. This course is especially designed for students who are interested in pursuing education, special education, music therapy, or just love to sing fun music!

A capella ensembles– all auditioned treble & bass voices

STUDENT ACCOUNT - Each choir student has an individual Student Account. Money earned through fundraisers is credited to this account. Funds from the account may be used for voice lessons, choir fees, summer camps or any Fine Arts related activity (must be approved by Director). Student must fill out a Student Account Payment Request form and submit it to Ms. Langley (see attached). Blank forms are available in the choir office and on the website. You will receive monthly statements of your student account activity. If you have any questions email jhscaps@gmail.com.

PAYMENTS - Payment of choir fees, concert tickets, show choir costume fees, etc. may be made in the following ways:

- 1) Check made payable to cap+s - please identify what you are paying for in the memo section.
- 2) Cash - Send exact amount.

NOTE: Payment by check or cash should be placed in an envelope with the STUDENT NAME and “CHOIR” on the outside of the envelope as well as what the payment covers.

- 3) Student may also use available credit balances in his/her Student Account by turning in a completed “Student Account Payment Request” form mentioned above.
- 4) You may make payment by credit card, debit card, or bank transfer, directly through Intuit’s secure website by clicking on the “View and Pay Invoice” button on the invoices received from jhscaps@gmail.com.

Note: You do not incur any fees paying through this method [paying through Paypal is no longer an option].

PRIVATE TEACHERS - We have private voice teachers on staff. Currently we have two instructors that teach at Hersey, Tricia Toledo and Ronald Watkins. Students may take private lessons during part of their choir block, study hall, or after school (30 minutes) once a week. The teachers will make a presentation during the first week of school at which time students can sign up for lessons. Students are urged to take private lessons as much as possible. **Chamber Singers are strongly encouraged to take private lessons.** See website for biographies. Lessons are taught through Community Education and a separate registration and payment must be made. As a D214 student, you receive a reduced rate for your lessons! We are including information regarding registration, etc. in this packet.

cap+s - Choral Association of Parents + Students (cap+s) is our parent booster group. All families are asked to become members to show support of the choral program. See enclosed form for fees. The group meets on the first Tuesday of every month (see Choral Calendar) at 7:00 PM in the Faculty Lounge. All parents are urged to attend all meetings and become involved. It’s a great place to get information first-hand as Ms. Michael/Ms. Langley attend each meeting. The need for parent volunteers doesn’t end in junior high. Time commitments for volunteer tasks vary and we can find something that will work for your schedule. Please complete the talent survey in your folder to help us get to know you all as well. The work of this group benefits **each student** and has a major impact on the opportunities we are able to provide for our students. FUNDRAISERS - We provide several fundraisers during the year which give opportunities to students to earn funds for their Student Accounts. In most cases, students earn 30-50% of the profit for their individual account. In September, we will hold a Fall Plant sale and in October a Mattress Sale. On an average, each month we have eat & share events at local restaurants. These are listed on the choir calendar and on our social media pages.

Cap+s has three main fundraisers that benefit the students as well as the entire choral program. These include Hey Nonny! Choir Fundraiser in January, Chicagoland Showcase is our nationally recognized show choir competition and the Spring Extravaganza which includes senior recognition and choir award ceremony. However, we have additional events throughout the year. More information to follow.

Our largest event is the **31st Annual Chicagoland Showcase March 1 & 2**, a show choir competition to which middle and high school show choirs from all over the country come to compete. Last year, we had high schools from Minnesota, Ohio, Indiana, and Wisconsin bring groups. In previous years, we have had schools from as far away as California, Mississippi and Alabama attend. It truly is a nationally recognized competition and an amazing day where every parent and student are expected to volunteer. The proceeds from this event benefit the **entire choir**, not just show choir.

There are many additional opportunities connected with the above fundraisers for students to raise funds for their Student Accounts. Please watch emails for details as they are announced.

HOW DOES MY STUDENT BENEFIT FROM THE FUNDS RAISED BY CAPS? Examples of the use of the funds cap+s has raised include: the purchase of a grand piano for the choir room, pianos for the private voice studios, sound system and microphones to use when choirs perform in the community, concert expenses, student awards, workshops with guest clinicians, student scholarships for summer camps, and financial need etc. Cap+s makes every effort, through our fundraising, to enhance the choir experience for your student.

FINANCIAL NEED: No student who has financial need will be prohibited from participating in choir or show choir. Cap+s provides financial aid scholarship opportunities to help with show choir and private voice lesson expenses. The criteria are outlined in the letter/application form. The criteria must be met in order for payment to be made. This scholarship is held in strict confidence. **The application form is available from Ms. Michael/Ms. Langley. Application must be made prior to the beginning of the payment cycle.**

SERVICE POINTS: We encourage students to participate fully in the volunteer opportunities available throughout the year. They will be recognized at our awards ceremony at the Spring Extravaganza. We offer many events and opportunities for students to earn choral service points. Please encourage your students to be active members of the choir program in all aspects. We want to encourage our students to see the value in volunteering.
